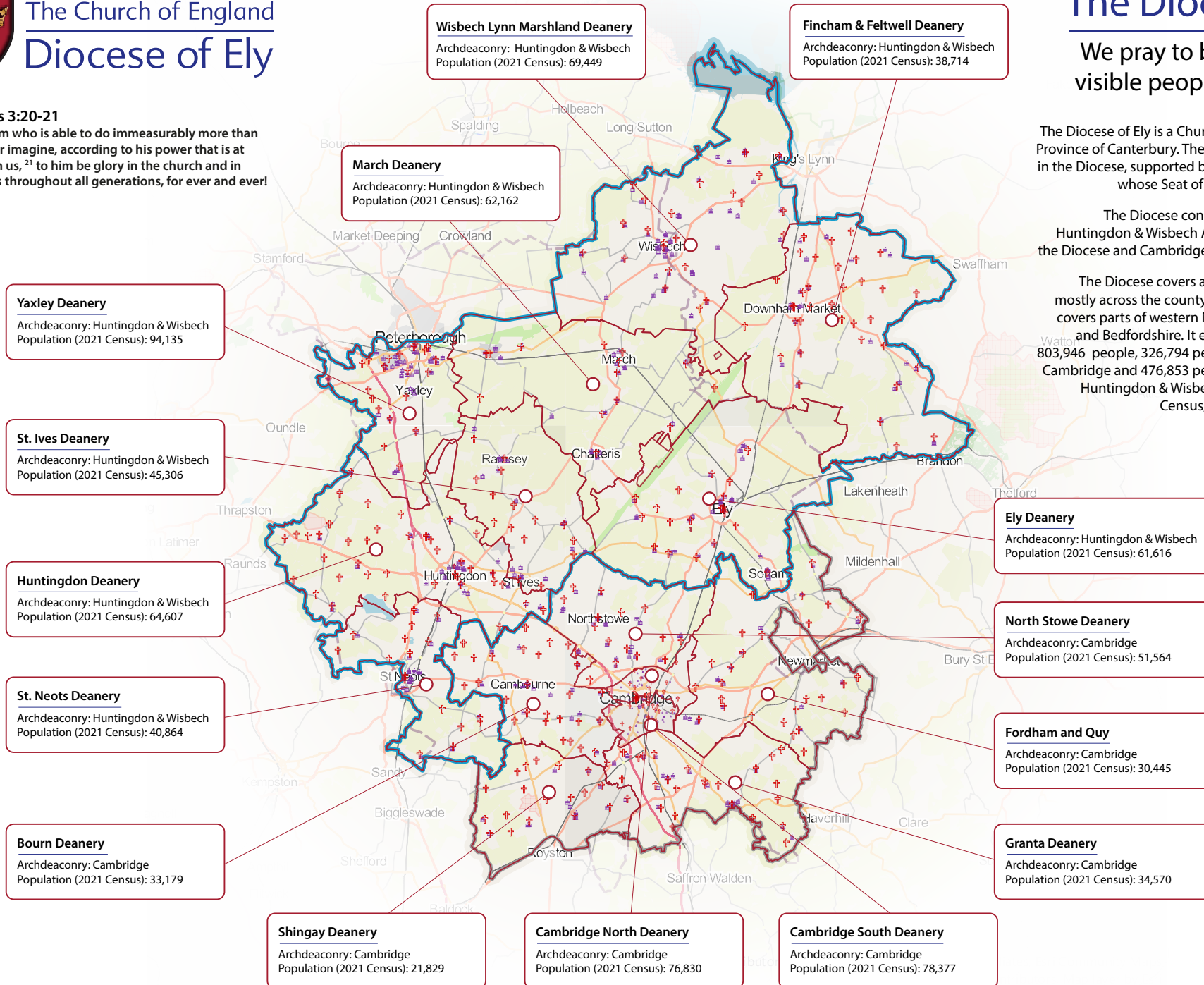
# The Diocese of Ely

We pray to be generous and visible people of Jesus Christ

The Diocese of Ely is a Church of England diocese in the Province of Canterbury. The Bishop of Ely leads the work in the Diocese, supported by the Bishop of Huntingdon, whose Seat of Authority is at Ely Cathedral.

The Diocese consists of two Archdeacons - Huntingdon & Wisbech Archdeaconry in the north of the Diocese and Cambridge Archdeaconry in the South.

The Diocese covers an area of 1,507 square miles, mostly across the county of Cambridgeshire, but also covers parts of western Norfolk, Peterborough, Essex and Bedfordshire. It encompasses a population of 803,946 people, 326,794 people in the Archdeaconry of Cambridge and 476,853 people in the Archdeaconry of Huntingdon & Wisbech (as measured in the 2021 Census, small variations may occur).
